Dear Colleagues,

Let me remind you that the ESC Statutes determine the norms of representation of National Federations at the General Assembly:

- according to Art. 5.8, one federation representing all shooting sports will have two votes and may be represented by one or two delegates;
- according to Art. 5.9, if a country is represented by two federations, each federation is entitled to one vote and one delegate;
- According to Art. 5.10, member federations may be represented by proxy, given in writing. One member federation may not represent more than one other member federation. Member federations with one vote may only hold one proxy vote. Member federations with two votes may hold two proxy votes.

There is a certain number of rooms booked in the "Renaissance Moscow Olympic Hotel" for the participants of the GA through travel agency REISEBUERO "WELT". In case you indicate in the GA Registration form that you prefer to stay in the "Renaissance Moscow Olympic Hotel" you should get a confirmation and an invoice from REISEBUERO "WELT".

For those of you who need visa to come to Russia special arrangements will be done after you complete the GA Registration forms and send them back to the ESC Secretariat. That is why we ask you to complete the GA Registration forms at your earliest convenience.

National Federations applying for European Championships 2016-2017 are welcome to make presentations at the General Assembly. However, such presentations should have a maximum length of 5 minutes and should be handed over to the ESC Secretariat on May 17 at 14.00 latest.

The minutes of the proceedings of the XXIV General Assembly will be sent to the Member Federations within two month after the meeting.

Numbers of articles in the Guidelines to the Statutes, in the Guidelines for the Technical Committee and in the Guidelines for the Press and Promotion Committee will be changed in accordance with the adopted changes of numbers of the articles in the ESC Statutes.

THE GUIDELINES FOR THE ATHLETES' COMMITTEE

The duties of the Athletes' Committee are the following:

- 1. To consider issues related to athletes and to report to the ESC;
- 2. To gather information and opinions on athletes' needs and problems during training and competitions at the European Championships;
- 3. Torepresent the rights and interests of athletes and to make related recommendations to the ESC Presidium;
- 4. To maintain contact with the ISSF Athletes' Committee;
- 5. To support the fight against doping.

The Athletes' Committee consists of seven (7) athletes (2 Rifle, 2 Pistol, 2 Shotgun and one Running target athlete), elected by athletes during the European Championships (the last ECH of discipline group before the elections). Rifle, Pistol and Shotgun must be represented by one man and one woman each.

The Athletes' Committee is composed of a majority of athletes who, at the time of their election/nomination, are at least participating in competitions of the european or/and international level in the corresponding dicipline group (Pistol, Rifle, Shotgun and RT), or have done so within the previous four years.

The Athlete's Committee convenes at least once a year, according to invitation of the Chairperson of the Athletes' Committee or the ESC President. The ESC President has a right to invite the representative of the Athletes Committee to take part in the Presidium meeting when the topic on the agenda is related to the rights and interests of athletes. The minutes of the Committee meetings must be submitted to the President within four (4) weeks, and proposals at least six (6) weeks before the next meeting of the Presidium.

The Athletes' Committee is represented at the ESC General Assembly by two members who must be athletes elected by the Committee, who have no voting right, but have the right to speak.

The term of office is four years. The members of the Athletes' Committee are eligible for re-election, but only once.

The nominations will be done by the Member Federations – one nomination per Member Federation.

The ESC Member Federations may present a candidate for the Athletes' Committee according to the Guidelines to the ESC Statutes, but not earlier than two (2) months before and not later than 15 days before the day of the opening ceremony of the European Championships.

The Secretary General will establish a list of all nominated candidates including a C.V. separately for each discipline group. This list will be published at the ESC website.

With the accreditation of all participating athletes in the European Championships each athlete will be given a voting paper showing all the candidates and all the information on the voting procedure.

Each athlete may vote for a maximum of two (2) athletes in Pistol, Rifle and Shotgun and one (1) in Running target shooting discipline. The two (2) athletes in Rifle, Pistol and Shotgun and one athlete in Running Target who have received the highest number of votes, will be considered elected as members of the Athletes' Committee.

The Chairperson has to be elected by the Athletes' Committee members during their first meeting.

The ESC Memeber Federation is obliged to support and cover all necessary costs of its athlete in the Athletes' Committee.
